Dear Ms. Matula:

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I am responding to your letters concerning the Medicaid inpatient psychiatric benefit for individuals under age 21. As you indicated, there have been several statutory and policy changes relating to this benefit in recent years.

As you know, we are currently developing revised regulations which will define the settings that may be used for this benefit and establish standards for these settings. During the period before these regulations are promulgated, States that offer this benefit may elect to provide it in **psychiatric** hospitals that meet the definition in section 1861(f) of the Social Security Act and, if a State wishes to offer this benefit in other types of psychiatric facilities, these facilities must meet the current regulatory requirements in Subpart D of 42 CFR Part 441. **Each State** that offers this benefit must indicate in the State plan what setting(s) it includes. States that **do** not wish to provide this benefit in any setting other than psychiatric hospitals are under **no** obligation to do so.

Although you did not raise the issue of inpatient psychiatric services that must be provided to an individual under age 21 when the need for them is determined as a result of an EPSDT screen, we thought that this topic should be addressed because the same age group is Involved. We believe that a State could 'determine that a psychiatric hospital could provide any medically necessary inpatient service that an individual may require and that it is not medically necessary to provide

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(inpatient psychiatric services in additional lower level of care settings for these individuals.

I hope that this has been helpful.
